Minutes of the March 10, 2016 meeting were submitted to fiscal court members for review prior to today's meeting and on a motion of Commissioner Wathen, seconded by Commissioner Castlen with all the Court concurring said Minutes were approved and signed.

**By a motion of Commissioner Wathen, seconded by Commissioner Castlen, the court considered for approval all Claims for all Departments.
Without further discussion, Judge/Executive Mattingly called for a vote on the motion.
All members of the court voted in favor; motion passed.**

By a motion of Commissioner Wathen, seconded by Commissioner Koger, the court considered for approval Resolution 05-2016 - Transportation of Non-Public School Students.

By a motion of Commissioner Wathen, seconded by Commissioner Castlen, the court considered for approval to Advertise for Bid No. 05-2016: Yellow Creek Bridge.

Presented was the (04-2016) **First Reading of KOC 921.670 (2016)** - An Ordinance Amending Text in Article 21 of the Zoning Ordinance regarding the Downtown Overlay District and Adding Article 22 regarding Overlay Districts.



Judge Mattingly stated, "The reason we are considering this ordinance is to keep our ordinance the same as the city's."

Downtown resident Steve Jarvis brought to the court's attention noise problems affecting downtown residents. As this area is in the city, the court instructed him to first speak with city officials about this issue. County Attorney Porter noted that the city has a noise ordinance. Mr. Jarvis also informed the court of people coming onto his property to "relieve" themselves. Mr. Porter said that is trespassing and people may be arrested for that.
